Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God this is your true and proper worship.

Mankind is sinful and worthy of death; God has provided a way for mankind to be made right and whole again; that way is Jesus.

Therefore, **Lurge** you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

Paul urges (beseeches, appeals) to our greater good that is within us because of the sacrifice of Jesus.

This is another plural "you" which applies to all-of-y'all.

Paul appeals to us as family members; as equals.

Recognizing the mercy demonstrated by God is a basis for us to lay down our lives.

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, **to offer** your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

We offer ourselves wholly to God; we present our bodies, souls and spirits to him.

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer **YOUr**

bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

Paul could have made this offering theoretical but he chose to go for the practical/physical.

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies <u>as</u> <u>a living sacrifice</u>, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

In the Old Testament (Hebrew Bible) sacrifices were offered often and repeatedly. Because the sacrifice of Jesus is complete, we don't have to die; we may become living sacrifices.

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, **holy** and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

The only way for us to offer ourselves as holy is to accept the holiness (righteousness) of Jesus as our means to be holy.

God is pleased when we approach him with faith that leads to obedience.

As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

Deuteronomy 17:1 (NIV)

Do not sacrifice to the LORD your God an ox or a sheep that has any defect or flaw in it, for that would be detestable to him.

Luke 14:26-27 (NIV)

If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple. And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

Matthew 10:37-39 (NIV)
