Harmony, Pride, and Conceit

Today's Text: Romans 12:16 (NIV)

Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position (*Or willing to do menial work*). Do not be conceited.

John 13:1-17 (NIV)

It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.

The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. Jesus knew that

Jesus answered, “Those who have had a bath need only to wash their feet; their whole body is clean. And you are clean, though not every one of you.” For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean.
