Tabernacle Points to Jesus

Luke 24:13-27 (NIV)

Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; but they were kept from recognizing him.

He asked them, “What are you discussing together as you walk along?”

They stood still, their faces downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, “Are you the only one visiting Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?”

“What things?” he asked.

“About Jesus of Nazareth,” they replied. “He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. 




Tabernacle

our provider.




Table of Shewbread

Candlestick



The place of the presence of God; Jesus came to earth and 'tabernacled' with us, made his dwelling with us. Jesus provides for us to abide in him and he in us.




Exodus 27:1-8 and 38:1-7 (NIV)

Brazen Altar




Altar of Sacrifice

The Courtyard

There was only one entrance, one way, to get to the presence of God. Jesus is the gate into the presence.

Exodus 28:1-43 and 39:1-39 (NIV)

The Priestly Garments

Jesus is the Great High Priest who intercedes for us with the Father in heaven.



Exodus 30:1-10 and 37:25-28 (NIV)

The Altar of Incense

Fragrance from the Altar of Incense rose up as a representation of the prayers of the priests for the people. Jesus is our intercessor and provides a sweet aroma in the place of our natural stench.

Exodus 30:11-16 (NIV)

The Atonement Money

Everyone is equal in the eyes of the
LORD.

Exodus 30:17-21 and 38:8 (NIV)

Bronze Basin for Washing

The priests were to wash in this basin prior to going into the holy place to serve. Jesus is the living water that cleanses us, so we may approach the throne of God.



Brazen Laver

Exodus 30:22-33 and 37:29 (NIV)

The Holy Anointing Oil

Used to set apart (sanctify) holy people or objects used for worship. Jesus is the only true way to sanctification.

Exodus 30:34-38 and 37:29 (NIV)

The Incense

Holy to the LORD; the burning of the incense was representational of the prayers of the people going up to the LORD. The only way for those prayers to be effective is through Jesus.

Exodus 31:1-11 and 35:30-36:1 (NIV)

Artisans for Building the Tabernacle

Then the LORD said... “I have chosen... I have filled him with the Spirit of God, with wisdom, with understanding, with knowledge and with all kinds of skills... I have given ability to all the skilled workers to make everything I have commanded you...”

Exodus 31:12-18 (NIV)

The Sabbath Rest

Resting indicates a sign that God is our God and we are His people. Because Jesus is trustworthy, we can rely on him to carry us through times of rest.
