Luke 10:1-29

Luke 10:1-29 (NASB)

Now after this the Lord appointed seventy-two others, and sent them in pairs ahead of Him to every city and place where He Himself was going to come.

Luke 10:1-29 (NASB)

And He was saying to them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore plead with the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest. Go; behold, I am sending you out like lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no money belt, no bag, no sandals, and greet no one along the way.

Luke 10:1-29 (NASB)

And whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house.' And if a man of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in that house, eating and drinking what they provide; for the laborer is deserving of his wages. Do not move from house to house.

Luke 10:1-29 (NASB)

Whatever city you enter and they receive you, eat what is served to you; and heal those in it who are sick, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'

Luke 10:1-29 (NASB)

But whatever city you enter and they do not receive you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your city which clings to our feet we wipe off in protest against you; yet be sure of this, that the kingdom of God has come near.' I say to you, it will be more tolerable on that day for Sodom than for that city.

Luke 10:1-29 (NASB)

“Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the miracles that occurred in you had occurred in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. But it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon in the judgment than for you.

And you, Capernaum, will not be exalted to heaven, will you? You will be brought down to Hades!
