Luke 10:25-37

Luke 10:25-37 (NASB)

And behold, a lawyer stood up and put Him to the test, saying, “Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?” And He said to him, “What is written in the Law? How does it read to you?”

Luke 10:25-37 (NASB)

And he answered, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself.” And He said to him, “You have answered correctly; do this and you will live.”

Which of these three do you think proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell into the robbers' hands?" And he said, "The one who showed compassion to him."

Luke 10:25-37 (NASB)

Then Jesus said to him, “Go and do the same.”

1 John 4:7-14 (NASB)

Beloved, let's love one another; for love is from God, and everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. The one who does not love does not know God, because God is love. By this the love of God was revealed in us, that God has sent His only Son into the world so that we may live through Him.

1 John 4:7-14 (NASB)

In this is love, not that we loved God,
but that He loved us and sent His Son to
be the propitiation for our sins.
