Luke 19:28-48 (NASB)

After Jesus said these things, He was going on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

Ephesians 4:26-27, 31-32

Be angry, and yet do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not give the devil an opportunity.

All bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and slander must be removed from you, along with all malice.

Be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you.

Luke 19:28-48 (NASB)

After Jesus said these things, He was going on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

Luke 9:51 (NASB)

When the days were approaching for His ascension, He was determined to go to Jerusalem;

Luke 13:33-34 (NASB)

Nevertheless I must go on My journey today and tomorrow and the next day; for it cannot be that a prophet would perish outside Jerusalem. Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who have been sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, just as a hen gathers her young under her wings, and you were unwilling!

And they brought it to Jesus, and they threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. Now as He was going, they were spreading their cloaks on the road.

And as soon as He was approaching,
near the descent of the Mount of Olives,
the whole crowd of the disciples began
to praise God joyfully with a loud voice
for all the miracles which they had seen,
shouting:

When He approached Jerusalem, He saw the city and wept over it, saying, “If you had known on this day, even you, the conditions for peace! But now they have been hidden from your eyes.

For the days will come upon you when your enemies will put up a barricade against you, and surround you and hem you in on every side, and they will level you to the ground, and throw down your children within you, and they will not leave in you one stone upon another, because you did not recognize the time of your visitation.”

And Jesus entered the temple grounds and began to drive out those who were selling, saying to them, “It is written: ‘And My house will be a house of prayer,’ but you have made it a den of robbers.”
