




# Prayer Spotlight



Daughters, Criminals, a Centurian  
and THE KING  
Luke 23:26-49

Luke 23:26-49 (NASB)

And when they led Him away, they seized a man, Simon of Cyrene, as he was coming in from the country, and placed on him the cross to carry behind Jesus.

Now following Him was a large crowd of the people, and of women who were mourning and grieving for Him.

But Jesus turned to them and said,  
“Daughters of Jerusalem, stop weeping  
for Me, but weep for yourselves and for  
your children. For behold, days are  
coming when they will say, ‘Blessed are  
those who cannot bear, and the wombs  
that have not given birth, and the  
breasts that have not nursed.’

Luke 23:26-49 (NASB)

Then they will begin to say to the mountains, 'Fall on us,' and to the hills, 'Cover us.' For if they do these things when the tree is green, what will happen when it is dry?"

Now two others, who were criminals, were also being led away to be put to death with Him.

And when they came to the place called The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and the other on the left.

But Jesus was saying, “Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.” And they cast lots, dividing His garments among themselves. And the people stood by, watching.

And even the rulers were sneering at Him, saying, “He saved others; let Him save Himself if this is the Christ of God, His Chosen One.” The soldiers also ridiculed Him, coming up to Him, offering Him sour wine, and saying, “If You are the King of the Jews, save Yourself!”

Now there was also an inscription above Him, “THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS.”

One of the criminals who were hanged there was hurling abuse at Him, saying, “Are You not the Christ? Save Yourself and us!”

But the other responded, and rebuking him, said, “Do you not even fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed are suffering justly, for we are receiving what we deserve for our crimes; but this Man has done nothing wrong.”

And he was saying, “Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom!”  
And He said to him, “Truly I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise.”

Luke 23:26-49 (NASB)

It was now about the sixth hour, and darkness came over the entire land until the ninth hour, because the sun stopped shining; and the veil of the temple was torn in two. And Jesus, crying out with a loud voice, said, "Father, into Your hands I entrust My spirit." And having said this, He died.

Now when the centurion saw what had happened, he began praising God, saying, “This Man was in fact innocent.” And all the crowds who came together for this spectacle, after watching what had happened, began to return home, beating their chests.
