Matthew 20:17-34

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

Now Jesus was going up to Jerusalem. On the way, he took the Twelve aside and said to them, “We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and the teachers of the law.

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified. On the third day he will be raised to life!”

Mark 10:32-34 (NASB)

Now they were on the road going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking on ahead of them; and they were amazed, and those who followed were fearful. And again He took the twelve aside and began to tell them what was going to happen to Him, saying, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem,

and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and will hand Him over to the Gentiles. And they will mock Him and spit on Him, and flog Him and kill Him; and three days later He will rise from the dead.”

Luke 18:31-33 (NASB)

Now He took the twelve aside and said to them, “Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and all the things that have been written through the prophets about the Son of Man will be accomplished. For He will be handed over to the Gentiles, and will be ridiculed, and abused, and spit upon,

Luke 18:31-33 (NASB)

and after they have flogged Him, they will kill Him; and on the third day He will rise.” The disciples understood none of these things, and the meaning of this statement was hidden from them, and they did not comprehend the things that were said.

First Recorded Prediction

- Matthew 16:21-23
- Mark 8:31-33
- Luke 9:22

Jesus states that he will go to Jerusalem, suffer, be killed, and be raised the third day. Peter rebukes Jesus.

Second Recorded Prediction

- Matthew 17:22-23
- Mark 9:30-32
- Luke 9:43-45

Jesus predicts his going to be delivered into the hands of men, killed, and raised on the third day. The disciples are deeply grieved.

Some Predictions in John's Gospel

- John 2:19-21 Cryptic “Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days.”
- John 3:14-15 “Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up.”

Some Predictions in John's Gospel

- John 10:11-18 “I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.”
- John 12:24 “Truly, truly I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.”

Back to Matthew 20

- Jesus has just plainly explained what will happen when they enter Jerusalem (trial, mocking, suffering, death, and then being raised on the third day).
- Mrs. Thunder responds by asking for a favor regarding her sons.

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favor of him.

“What is it you want?” he asked.

She said, “Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom.”

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

“You don’t know what you are asking,” Jesus said to them. “Can you drink the cup I am going to drink?”

“We can,” they answered.

Jesus said to them, “You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant.

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by my Father.”

When the ten heard about this, they were indignant with the two brothers.

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

Jesus called them together and said,
“You know that the rulers of the Gentiles
lord it over them, and their high officials
exercise authority over them. Not so
with you.

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave—just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.”

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

As Jesus and his disciples were leaving Jericho, a large crowd followed him. Two blind men were sitting by the roadside, and when they heard that Jesus was going by, they shouted, “Lord, Son of David, have mercy on us!”

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

The crowd rebuked them and told them to be quiet, but they shouted all the louder, “Lord, Son of David, have mercy on us!”

Jesus stopped and called them. “What do you want me to do for you?” he asked.

Matthew 20:17-34 (NASB)

“Lord,” they answered, “we want our sight.”

Jesus had compassion on them and touched their eyes. Immediately they received their sight and followed him.

Numbers 6:24-26 (NASB)

The LORD bless you, and keep you;
The LORD cause His face to shine
on you, and be gracious to you; The
LORD lift up His face to you, and
give you peace.
